YEAR IN REVIEW

In June we officially launched our virtual programming! We offered fun and stimulating content as well as mental health check-ins to keep our members engaged during this period of social isolation.








We opened our doors back to members of all ages in September! From toddlers to seniors we were excited to welcome members back to Dawson after being limited to primarily connecting virtually over the spring and summer.



The centre underwent a considerable physical transformation during the summer. We updated the colours of our first floor to create a fresher, welcoming atmosphere!

In August we received around 250 boxes containing over 5,000 articles of clothing from Banana Republic! With these donations we were able to provide clothing to our members, the community, and partner organizations.

Dawson offered This Way ONward; a job preparation program for youth 16-24 years old in collaboration with Old Navy Canada.



Dawson strives to provide an environment where people of all ages are able to learn to live a healthy, active life. With support from funders like Canadian Tire Jumpstart Charities and BGC Canada we were able to provide countless hours of fun, recreational activities for our members to support healthy habits during the pandemic.

With support from RECLAIM Literacy and Literacy Quebec we were able to distribute dozens of books to our youngest members to share the love of reading.

In partnership with Arrondissement de Verdun, we launched the Brigade Neige program! This initiative by our youth and Beurling Academy students helps those with limited mobility by shoveling snow off their walkways.

In March we received a 2021 Hyundai Santa Fe from Hyundai Canada for one year! This will make it easier for us to provide life-changing programs and community-based services for the next twelve months.

FEBRUARY



Dawson hosted a free Webinar on how to start an RESP! We included information on how to access free money for a child's education and awarded several RESP bursaries from BGC Dawson.

This year, we launched virtual music lessons for youth ages 12-18. Through the 8-week course, participants learned the fundamentals of guitar playing and more!

PARENTS AND TOTS

The Parents and Tots Program is a safe space where families who have children under the age of 5 can find support, resources and activities that will help their little ones build on their development.

Throughout the summer, we offered support at local parks by providing play equipment for parents to use. We also provided parents with possible activities and games to play with their children to help stimulate their development.

This past year, we hosted our annual Grinchmas celebration. This yearly event has our parents and tots team retell the holiday classic with puppets and more. We launched online programming for the first time, including our Karibou program, which is a motor skills development course for children.

We offered more respite blocks from September 2020 to December 2021. We were required to limit the number of families during the parent-child activities in order to adhere to government-mandated safety guidelines. We also continued our parent-child activities but reduced the time and number of families during the time-slot. This created an additional program block and permitted us to accommodate families who wanted to join during the pandemic.

The 4-12 program has 4 distinct program areas; after school, day camps, weekend, and virtual programs. All of our programs include educational, recreational and artistic components to enrich the development of children in our care. Our main objective is to offer a safe and inclusive space where members can develop new skills and learn positive habits to live healthy, active lives.

To keep members engaged throughout the pandemic, we launched a variety of virtual programs. From the summer of 2020 to the spring of 2021, we continuously offered activities that supported all aspects of positive mental health.

With the addition of our virtual programs, we were able to offer our activities to children regardless of their proximity to Verdun.

When we reopened doors to members in the fall for the after school program, we had to continually adapt to ever changing safety measures. Although we had to modify our usual programming structure, we were still able to offer the same BGC Dawson experience in collaboration with other programs.

YOUTH

The Youth Programs provide social, recreational, and educational activities for preteens, teens and young adults. We offer brave spaces for youth to become decision makers on issues that directly impact them. We encourage the model: For Youth By Youth. We don't shy away from difficult conversations because truth telling and testimonials are instrumental for healing. We foster strength-based, participatory and trauma-informed approaches in all group discussions. We welcome preteens, teens, and young adults from all over Montreal. The Youth Programs population is a melting pot of peoples, cultures and individuals that come together to create an environment that celebrates differences.



Dawson's Youth programming responded to the accessibility restrictions created by the COVID-19 pandemic by offering online/virtual curriculum for our regular programs. Youth were also presented a hybrid option in which they could participate in the programming, 2 days virtual and 3 days in person. This helped provide safety, consistency and stability for our participants. The youth who participated in virtual programming benefited by having communication with animators and other teens as opposed to solely members of their household.

SENIORS

The BGC Dawson Seniors Program provides social, educational and recreational programs and services to members of our community over the age of 50. Our desire is for every senior participating in our programs to feel welcomed and valued.

The COVID-19 pandemic left many of our seniors isolated and cut off from programs and services that had become part of their lives. In April 2020, we launched health and wellness check-ins for 80 of our members and happily provided food assistance and other relief efforts as needed.

In the spring of 2020, we were able to provide our annual Tax Clinic service in an adapted format that respected COVID-19 protocols. We are grateful for our faithful volunteer, Mr. Quoc-Duong, for completing 74 tax returns for community members this year!



56 HOURS OF VIRTUAL PROGRAMMING



During the winter months, we offered seasonal flu-shots to our members in collaboration with the CLSC. We were happy to participate in a community initiative to deliver catered meals to isolated individuals. During the holiday season, we distributed baskets containing assorted cookies, a calendar and a homemade card from children in our programs.

We are pleased to share that several of our classes made the transition to a digital format for the fall, winter, and spring seasons. Gabrielle Roddy provided weekly fitness classes that included social interaction at the end of each class. Many of our seniors are now zoom experts!

FOOD AND SUSTAINABILITY

The Food and Sustainability department at Dawson consist of four distinct programs: Dawson Kitchen, Dawson Gardens, Mobile Markets and the Food Bank. Dawson's Food and Sustainability department is dedicated to ensuring the community has access to healthy food and is committed to reducing waste and building ecologically friendly food systems.

KITCHEN



Dawson Kitchen cooked 5000+ healthy and delicious meals and snacks for members in our programs as well as the community through our weekly market.

RECUPERATION



Our partnership in the food recuperation network saved 8500 kg of food from becoming waste and helped us feed citizens living with food insecurity.

GARDEN



This program taught how to grow food through workshops and participation in our collective gardens. Food harvested through one of our gardens supports our food security initiatives.

MOBILE MARKET



The mobile market initiative brought fresh fruits and vegetables into local HLMs helping residents with low mobility access fresh produce at low cost.

FOOD BANK



Our food bank distributed over 2800 food baskets to our most vulnerable neighbours and fed over 4800 individuals. Moisson Montreal provided 25,000 kg of food this year.

MUSIC

The main objective of Dawson's music program is to provide an opportunity for children and youth to discover or nurture a passion for music and acquire the necessary skills to continue their musical growth throughout the rest of their lives, whether it be on a professional or hobbyist level.

All students are encouraged to experiment with multiple facets of music to see what aspects of the art inspires them creatively and intellectually.

The music program migrated to virtual programming in 2021. This development required the use of additional instruments and the creation of a system to lend them out to all interested in participating virtually. These sessions were comprised of groups of up to 8 students who were all provided with instruments and lesson material with a new musical topic each week. Providing access to musical instruments has been hugely beneficial in terms of ensuring that no child is left out due to lack of resources.

From the bottom of our hearts, we thank Darley for her passion, enthusiasm, and dedication that has made BGC Dawson an inspiring place to be!





VOLUNTEERING
